Children and youth in or from the child welfare system often identify the importance of finding stable, caring and nurturing lifelong connections. That is why the Adoption Council of Canada is committed to working together with the Ottawa community to improve the outcomes for children and youth in or from Ontario's child welfare system.

The Adoption Council of Canada has launched a Call to Action to ensure children and youth, and those that work to support them, have access to the appropriate services needed in order to create more opportunities that lead to permanent connections and if possible, family.

How You Can Help!

- 1. Write, call or meet with your MPP to increase funding to all forms of permanency including legal custody. Children's Aid Societies need more dollars earmarked for permanency.

- 2. Consider fostering. Open your home to children and youth that enter or stay in care. Foster parents help children and youth develop in a nurturing and stable environment. Family-based care is the best option for at-risk children and youth.

- 3. Consider adopting from your local Children's Aid Society to create a stable, lifelong connection for a child, teen, or young adult.

- 5. Contact your federal MP and ask them to support the creation of a Children's Commissioner. We need to know how Canada's children are doing.
